Higher Prices Are The New Normal

I've been writing about the coming higher prices for several months now, sending regular updates about the market and news. The fact that higher prices are now upon us shouldn't be a surprise to our customers who've been paying attention.

There are shortages on certain items in the marketplace and there will be more. This is a supply driven market with higher prices due to short supplies. Steel suppliers are paying higher prices with every order to replace their inventory. Each time mills charge a new higher replacement cost, the dealers must raise their prices accordingly. Additionally, many mill orders were canceled, creating supply shortages.

It's my opinion that the whole price structure has just shifted higher. I don't think this is temporary, or a spike that will come down sharply. **This higher pricing is the new normal.**

The domestic mills are raising prices every week or two.

I cringe and buy at the new higher price, then two weeks later that order looked like a genius move since prices moved up so much since then. Prices will find their level ground, but for now the trend is still up. Until the mills stop selling out their offered production, they will continue raising the price for each next month's production.

Think of it this way: if you could only make 1,000 widgets a month and you sold out your full capacity in three days, it would make sense to raise the price each month until you found a level where you sold fewer widgets at a much higher price. I know some people think it's wrong to do that, but I assure you, it is right and it's the way businesses maximize profit from their capacity. It is called price discovery. The steel mills are no different. As much as we all dislike higher prices, the mills are getting higher prices every time they ask for more.

Trump has everything to do with these prices and his decision to move forward with the tariffs. Some countries have been exempted, but they're coming back to the market with prices only slightly lower than domestic production. In addition, there still a lot of uncertainty around the exempted countries and whether there will be a tariff added later, when we don't expect it.

I talk about dealing with experts in my book. If you're not dealing with expert suppliers in their field, you should take a second look at who you're doing business with. We make money by selling steel, but the service we provide in expert advice and consultations to assist our customers is where dealing with us pays off.

Right now, we're making deals with those who want to lock in steel to ensure availability. Call us NOW and maybe we can still help you!

Our existing customers get first shot. If you don't have something locked in with us, there are no guarantees. If we have no deal in place, your prices will be much higher than they are today. That was the closing line of the last two months' newsletters and it still applies today!

Stainless sheet: Prices are UP. Stainless has taken huge jump in prices since the tariff announcement. Most offshore stainless is arriving from non-exempt countries. The trend continues to be up.

Galvanized sheet: Prices are UP. Prices continue to move up, non-exempt countries is where most of the offshore galvanized is coming from.

▲ Galvanized 60" wide Domestic Stenciled: Prices are UP. Base prices are up for May production. I'm expecting another increase again for June production.

Hot Rolled: Prices are UP. Prices have exploded in the past 6 weeks. The trend is up right now.
