If you are planning a trip to Fredericksburg this month, don't miss out on the *2018 Grape Stomp*. This event marks the beginning of the grape harvest. This age-old tradition is now done with machines, but you can get in on the action of stomping the grapes yourself during this time. You can pick from any one of the over 2 dozen wineries to go to.

So, you say grape stomping isn't your thing? How about food?? Enjoy the culinary delights from over 105 restaurants in the area. They range from fine dining, all the way to food trucks. Get some German pancakes from the *Old German Bakery and Restaurant* for breakfast, then move on to the *Fredericks-burg Brewing Company* for a craft beer and Schinken Schnitzel or Sausage Sampler for lunch. Trust me, you won't be hungry for the rest of the day!

Walk off your 'food coma' in the 150 downtown shops, boutiques and art galleries along Main St. Make sure to stop in at *Dooley's* 5, 10 and 25 cent Store for an old fashioned shopping experience. Then 'march' over to the *National Museum of the Pacific War*. This is the only museum dedicated to the battles of the Pacific, exhibits for adults and children alike. Tickets are good for 2 days, so you'll have plenty of time to explore all of the most notable events of WWII in the Pacific.

Your day wouldn't be complete without a night cap. *Grape Creek Vineyards* on Main is the place to go! They are in the heart of downtown Fredericksburg, and they offer scenic tours, a visit to the barrel room and cellar and tasting room. Enjoy live music in the evenings.
